McIntyre has served in the U.S. House of Representatives since Jan. 3, 1997 (Biographical Directory of the United States Congress)</p> <p>FY 2014 Budget Resolution</p> <p>On March 21, 2013, Rep. McIntyre voted against adoption of the FY 2014 Budget Resolution. (CQ Vote #88, H. Con. Res. 25, 3/21/2013)</p> <p>On March 21, 2013, <i>The Hill</i> reported that the FY 2014 budget plan “would balance in a decade.” (<i>The Hill</i>, 3/21/13)</p> <p>FY 1999 – FY 2001 Budget Resolutions</p> <p>On June 5, 1998, Rep. McIntyre voted against adoption of the FY 1999 Budget Resolution – a budget plan that spent \$1.72 trillion and took \$1.75 trillion in revenues. (CQ Vote #210, H. Con. Res. 284, 6/5/98)</p> <p>On April 14, 1999, Rep. McIntyre voted against adoption of the FY 2000 Budget Resolution – a budget plan that spent \$1.74 trillion and took \$1.87 trillion in revenues. (CQ Vote #85, H. Con. Res. 68, 4/14/99)</p> <p>On April 13, 2000, Rep. McIntyre voted against adoption of the FY 2001 Budget Resolution – a budget plan that spent \$1.78 trillion and took \$1.95 trillion in revenues. (CQ Vote #125, H. Con. Res. 290, 4/13/00)</p> <p>Skyrocketing Debt</p> <p>On Jan. 3, 1997, the United States’ total public outstanding debt was \$5,305,656,663,283.67 (TreasuryDirect.gov)</p> <p>As of July 22, 2013, the United States’ total public outstanding debt was \$16,738,126,867,888.58 (TreasuryDirect.gov)</p>

<p>McIntyre leased three cars and gave us the bill.</p>	<p>On March 12, 2006, <i>The Sun News</i> reported, “Taxpayers paid more than \$1 million last year for members of Congress to lease vehicles, including dozens of sport utility vehicles and luxury cars.” (<i>The Sun Times</i>, 3/12/06)</p> <p>According to the same article, “A few leased two cars on the taxpayers’ dime; two lawmakers - including Rep. Mike McIntyre, D-N.C., whose district includes Brunswick County - leased three.” (<i>The Sun Times</i>, 3/12/06)</p> <p>According to <i>The Sun News</i> article, Rep. McIntyre leased three cars (Chevy Trailblazer; Pontiac Grand Prix; Pontiac Bonneville) at \$13,130.40 and billed to the taxpayers. (<i>The Sun Times</i>, 3/12/06)</p>
<p>Charged us for his anniversary in a five-star Italian hotel.</p>	<p>On June 24, 2011, the <i>Huffington Post</i> reported, “Summer is upon us and that means only one thing in the nation’s capital: time for Congress to take a holiday at government expense. Friday evening, a government jet carrying six House members, four of their wives, three congressional staffers and five members of the military, including an Army doctor in case anyone gets sick along the way, will taxi down the runway at Andrews Air Force Base.” (<i>Huffington Post</i>, 6/24/11)</p> <p>According to the <i>Huffington Post</i>, Rep. McIntyre was one of the Members who took the trip, and “According to the itinerary, Dee and Mike McIntyre will celebrate their 29th wedding anniversary in Rome.” (<i>Huffington Post</i>, 6/24/11)</p> <p>According to the <i>Huffington Post</i>, “After flying overnight to Rome, the coterie will check in Saturday for two nights at a 5-star hotel on the famous and expensive Via Veneto. Lunch follows at a quiet restaurant near the Vatican before the group heads off for a tour. Then it’s ‘evening at leisure.’” (<i>Huffington Post</i>, 6/24/11)</p>

(Congressional Research Service, 6/20/13)</p> <p>Since Jan. 1, 2009, Rep. McIntyre’s taxpayer-funded salary has increased to \$174,000. (Congressional Research</p>
